195th Wing History

The 195th began as a Tactical Airlift Group on 15 May 1971. It was assigned to the California Air National Guard's 146th Tactical Airlift Wing based out of Van Nuys Municipal Airport in Los Angeles, California. Initial aircraft assigned was the C-130A Hercules. In 1973, the unit received the C-130B model. From 1971 to 1974, the Group successfully executed its flying mission in support of Tactical Air Command throughout the United States. With the end of the Vietnam War, the need for airlift decreased and the National Guard Bureau and Headquarters California National Guard agreed to downsize the 146th Tactical Airlift Wing as part of the post war drawdown. The 195th Tactical Airlift Group and assigned squadrons were inactivated on 30 September 1974. Personnel, Equipment and aircraft were reassigned to 146th units.

On 1 September 2015, the 195th was reactivated and redesignated as the 195th Wing. The Wing is based at Beale Air Force Base, California, assigned to the California Air National Guard with Air Force Space Command as the gaining Major Command. The 195th Wing is the realization of a major California Air National Guard transformational effort that began in the 162d Combat Communications Group in 2001. Along with the creation of the Wing, the following units were constituted and assigned to the 195th Wing on 1 September 2015: 195th Force Support Flight, 195th Comptroller Flight, 195th Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance Group, and 195th Operations Group. The units assigned to the Groups were reassigned from the 162d Combat Communications Group which was inactivated on 1 September 2015.

The 195th Wing is one of five major organizations that make up the California Air National Guard. It is comprised of eleven subordinate units located at five operating locations throughout the State. The 195th is the hub for all non-flying, non-kinetic global effects operations for the California Air National Guard leading the way in Cyber, Intelligence and Space mission areas.





Commander CA Air National Guard

Brigadier General Steven J. Butow

Brig. Gen. Steven J. Butow serves as Commander, California Air National Guard. In this role, he is the primary advisor to The Adjutant General on all strategic planning, programs. and operations affecting the California Air National Guard. He is responsible for the mission readiness and operational effectiveness across a broad spectrum of programs and activities involving five wings and over 4900 military and civilian personnel serving at ten locations within California. In this role, General Butow oversees development of operationally trained, equipped, and mission ready forces in support of national defense requirements



and emergency response, relief, and recovery operations throughout California

General Butow received his commission in 1989 from the Academy of Military Sciences, Knoxville, Tennessee, where he was recognized as a distinguished graduate. Upon earning his qualification as a combat rescue pilot, he made more than ten Air Expeditionary Force deployments in support of Operations DESERT STORM, SOUTHERN WATCH. PROVIDE COMFORT II, NORTHERN WATCH, IRAQI FREEDOM and ENDURING FREEDOM. General Butow was selected by Headquarters Air Force Special Operations Command as the HC-130 Working Group Chairman at the 2004 Combat Air Forces Weapons and Tactics Conference. He served as Deputy Director of the United States Central Command Joint Search and Rescue Center in 2005, and as the United States Air Forces Central Command Chief of Personnel Recovery in 2007. As the Vice Chief of the Joint Staff for the California Military Department, which leads the second largest state National Guard force in the nation, he shared responsibility for integrating and synchronizing joint forces to protect the state's population of 40 million and the fifth largest economy in the world. General Butow previously served as Special Assistant to the Director, Air National Guard for Headquarters Air Force, Plans, Programs and Requirements.

Colonel Robert M. Sage

Col Sage enlisted in the Air Force in 1982 as a Ground Radio Maintenance Technician. In January 1990, he joined the California Air National Guard, 234th Combat Communications Squadron, Hayward, CA. Where he served as an Electronic Maintenance Technician. As a Combat Communications Officer, he served in several positions including Base Systems Flight Commander, Network Systems Flight Commander, and Chief of Maintenance. When the 234th Combat Communications Squadron transitioned to an Intelligence



Squadron, he was the first member to attend Intelligence Officer training. Col Sage served as the first Air Force Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance Liaison Officer to an Army Division in Iraq and was instrumental in standing up the Mission Planning Cell at DGS-2.

Col Sage served as the first Chairman of the Air National Guard Cyber ISR weapon System Council and as a voting member of the Distributed Ground Station Weapon System Council. He served on the US Space Force ISR Reserve Component Senior Leader Steering Committee and also oversaw the establishment and operational employment of the Intelligence Analysis and Assessment (IAA) Processing Assessment and Dissemination (PAD) Cell for the California National Guard. He spent three years as the Commander of Joint Task Force Joint Reception Staging Onward Movement and Integration, (JTF JRSOI) responsible for all planning and decision making for the movement and integration of forces throughout the State of California in support of Domestic Operations.

Colonel de Jesus received his commission from the Academy of Military Science at McGhee-Tyson Air National Guard Base, Tenn., in April 1999. His career in the officer corps began as a Project Engineer, designing copper and fiber network systems for the Engineering Installation Squadron, located in Ohio, Massachusetts, and California. expeditionary engineering He led installation forces, establishing communication systems across Qatar, Afghanistan and bases. Iraq. Colonel de Jesus was a Research



Engineer at the Air Force Research Laboratory at Hanscom AFB, Mass., working on next-generation antenna arrays and wireless systems. He was the Network Systems Flight Commander and Chief of Maintenance for the Combat Communication Squadron, Van Nuys, Calif. He is a graduate of the Advanced Cyber Warfare Training at Hurlburt Field, Fla., and the first Cyberspace Operations Squadron lead Cvber commander the initial to Protection Team the Air National Guard. in
